(Macon County, MO) – During the week of July 14 – July 20, 2021, there were 32 new cases of COVID-19. Currently, there are 41 active cases with 6 residents hospitalized. Of these 32 new cases, only 4 were vaccinated with one of these vaccinated in the hospital, and, none were reinfection. Of the last 206 cases, 194 were not vaccinated.

Of the 32 positive cases, 3 were under 19; 6 in their 20's; 6 in their 30's; 7 in their 40's; 4 in their 50's; 3 in their 60's; 1 in their 70's; 1 in their 80's; and 1 of unknown age. Most of this week's new cases are in Macon city (11 cases), Atlanta (2 cases), Bevier (4 cases), Callao (1 cases), La Plata (5 cases), Ethel (2 cases), Elmer (1 case), and Excello (6 cases).

DHSS has now considered Macon, Randolph and Adair counties COVID-19 hotspots due to rising case rates. We encourage testing if you are symptomatic and vaccination if you haven't received it. Moderna, Pfizer and Johnson & Johnson vaccines are safe, free of charge, and proving effective against variants or minimizing health effects for those few vaccinated people who become infected. Macon County Health Department holds clinics weekly for Moderna and Johnson & Johnson. Call for an appointment or to speak to one of our nurses to answer questions you may have.

The following reflects COVID-19 in Macon County as of the end of the day on July 20, 2021 –

- 41 active cases
- 6 hospitalized
- 18 deaths
- 1,804 total cases since March 2020
