FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

(Macon County, MO) – During the week of November 10-16, we increased slightly to 32 new cases of COVID-19. Currently, there are 41 active cases with 3 residents hospitalized. Of these 32 new cases, 2 were vaccinated, and, there were no new cases of reinfection. Of the last 782 cases, 664 were not vaccinated.

Of the 32 positive cases, 7 were under 19 years of age; 4 in their 20’s; 5 in their 30’s; 5 in their 40’s; 4 in their 50’s; 4 in their 60’s; 3 in their 70’s; 0 in their 80’s; and, 0 in their 90’s. Most of this week’s new cases are in Macon city (15 cases), Anabel (0 cases), Atlanta (4 cases), Bevier (4 cases), Callao (0 cases), Elmer (0 cases), Ethel (1 case), Excello (1 cases), La Plata (5 cases), and, New Cambria (2 cases).

The Macon County Health Department offers Moderna, Pfizer and Johnson & Johnson vaccines weekly in their office. If planning to get a second or booster dose of Moderna, Pfizer or Johnson & Johnson, it is important to bring your vaccine card to determine eligibility and to update your record. Booster doses are now recommended for all three COVID-19 vaccines under certain conditions. The health department nurses are knowledgeable about vaccines and can help you determine booster dose eligibility. Both Samaritan Hospital and Macon County Health Department are offering these booster doses by appointment.

The following reflects COVID-19 in Macon County as of the end of the day on November 16, 2021 –

- 41 active cases
- 3 hospitalized
- 22 deaths (DHSS dashboard only reflects 20)
- 2,380 total cases since March 2020
