(Macon County, MO) – During the week of November 17-23, we increased to 40 new cases of COVID-19, compared to 32 last week, 29 the week before, and 31 reported the first week in November. Currently, there are 49 active cases with no residents hospitalized. Of these 40 new cases, 10 were vaccinated, and, there was 1 new case of reinfection. Of the last 822 cases, 694 were not vaccinated.

Of the 40 positive cases, 6 were under 19 years of age; 6 in their 20’s; 7 in their 30’s; 9 in their 40’s; 3 in their 50’s; 4 in their 60’s; 2 in their 70’s; 3 in their 80’s; and, 0 in their 90’s. Most of this week’s new cases are in Macon city (20 cases), Anabel (0 cases), Atlanta (3 cases), Bevier (1 case), Callao (2 cases), Elmer (2 cases), Ethel (1 case), Excello (2 cases), La Plata (7 cases), and, New Cambria (2 cases).

The Macon County Health Department offers Moderna, Pfizer and Johnson & Johnson vaccines weekly in their office. If planning to get a second or booster dose of Moderna, Pfizer or Johnson & Johnson, it is important to bring your vaccine card to determine eligibility and to update your record. Everyone ages 18 and older are now eligible for a booster dose for all three COVID-19 vaccines. The health department nurses are knowledgeable about vaccines and can help you determine booster dose eligibility. Both Samaritan Hospital and Macon County Health Department are offering these booster doses by appointment.

The following reflects COVID-19 in Macon County as of the end of the day on November 23, 2021 –

- 49 active cases
- 0 hospitalized
- 22 deaths (DHSS dashboard only reflects 20)
- 2,420 total cases since March 2020
